



2. [about 5 minutes] Read the last chapter of the book of Revelation. One person might read aloud the first five verses (Eden restored), another person read verses 6 to 11 (John and the angel) and a third person from verse 12 onwards (Epilogue). To make it more dramatic, separate readers could take the roles of the angel (6, 9, 10–11) and Jesus (7, 12–16, 20). All could join in with 'Come!' in verse 17.

1. [about 5 minutes] If you can, tell about a time when you experienced something 'better than new'; that is, something repaired or restored and turning out better than the original — a place, a thing, a relationship.

1. A beautiful vision (22:1–5)

List all the items John mentions in verses 1 to 5, and all the people. How would you go about sketching or painting the scene?

2. Eden restored

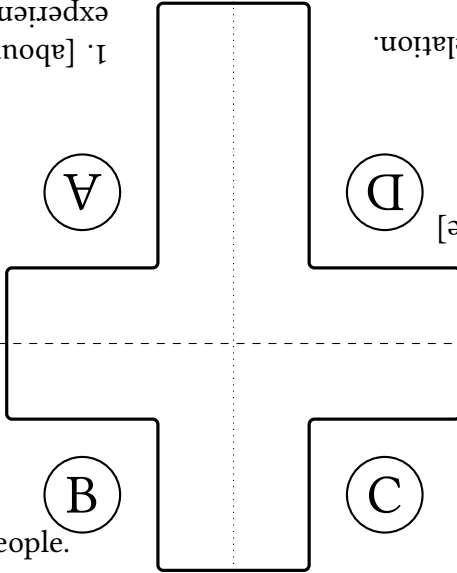
This description in the last book of the Bible brings to mind the description in the first book of the Bible. How are the pictures in Revelation 22:1–5 and Genesis 2:8–17 similar? How are they different?

3. Revelation 1, Revelation 22: book ends

We have seen that the last chapter in the last book of the Bible, Revelation 22, reflects the first chapters of the first book of the Bible, Genesis 1 and 2. In a similar way, the last chapter of Revelation contains echoes of the first chapter of Revelation. See how many connections you can find between Revelation 22 and Revelation 1.

4. **Angel worship wrong** (22:8–9)
John tries to worship the angel. Why? Why is this wrong? What good things might we wrongly worship?
5. **Trinity**
Where is the Trinity hinted at or mentioned?
6. **Warning: judgement**
What does this last chapter of the Bible warn about the persistently unrepentant (verses 11, 15)?
7. **Invitation: salvation**
In wonderful contrast, according to Revelation 22, what awaits the servants of God (verses 3, 5, 9, 7, 14, 17)?
8. **Jesus**
From first to last, the book of Revelation is fundamentally about Jesus. Identify all the places where Jesus appears in Revelation 22. What do we learn about Jesus from Revelation 22?

2. Take a moment to reflect on all you have learned from Revelation. What has stood out most?
