Revelation 2-3 to the seven churches

Week 2 • Sunday 14 August 2016

Revelation 2-3: focus on the victors

The messages to the seven churches all follow the same pattern. Michael Wilcock sums it up, using the first one as an example:

(1) *To the Ephesians* (2) *speaks the Holder of the seven stars*:
 (3) *I know certain good things about you*, (4) *but a bad thing too*, (5) *so repent*. (6) *Hear what the Spirit says*; (7) *the victor shall eat of the tree of life*.

We will focus on the last item. It refers to a victor or overcomer or conqueror. In Christ, all believers are victors; these promises still apply.

Ephesus (2:7)

What does the victor receive? What does this mean? Look back to Genesis 2:9 and look ahead to Revelation 22:2.

Smyrna (2:11)

What does the victor receive? Look ahead to Revelation 20:6, 20:14, 21:8 to learn more about this.

Pergamum (2:17)

What two things does the victor receive? What does the first mean? Exodus 16:4-36, John 6:25-59 should assist. (Note, commentators are not certain about the exact meaning of the second item.)

Thyatira (2:26-28)

A lot is promised to the victors here. Verse 27 quotes Psalm 2:9. 2 Corinthians 2:15-16 and John 20:23 might assist. Look ahead to Revelation 22:16.

Sardis (3:5)

Compare with Pergamum. See also Mark 8:38.

Philadelphia (3:12)

Again, 'name' features. Look ahead to Revelation 21:22.

Laodicea (3:21)

This has been called 'the most majestic reward of all'. What is it? If time permits, read Revelation 7:9-17.
