REFLECTIONS

By Bridget Ball (FAC member, 6pm) 2025 Fiji mission trip team member

Deciding to travel to Kenya as part of a mission team was not a choice I made lightly. I'd been privy to many perspectives on 'mission', with the majority of those being online, contradicting what I had heard growing up attending church, and what I understood our purpose to be as Christians.

I approached the trip with a mindset of both excitement toward the role I'd be taking in sharing the Gospel, and anxiety surrounding how my intentions would be perceived. I worried about having a 'white-saviour complex'; that our trip was one of self-indulgent volunteer work.

Did Kenyans need us? More alarmingly, did Kenyans even want us?

There was only one way to make sense of the contradictory concept mission was to me, and that was to engage in my own investigation. Even if it took me all the way to Africa!



To me, it felt so obvious that in going, even if we were wanted, there would still be an uncomfortable power imbalance at play. I thought mission was inherently transactional: we provide money, resources, training, etc., and in return receive gratitude and self-satisfaction.

I didn't want Kenyans to feel embarrassed to accept charity, and thus resolved myself to be open-minded, receptive, and willing to learn. This, I thought, would doubtless help ease inevitable feelings of humiliation, even guilt, Kenyans would experience because we were helping them. I noticed quickly that the Kenyans weren't at all embarrassed or ashamed. We weren't approached cautiously, like intruders, but with open arms of gratitude yet confidence. Sure, we laughed about how different we looked, and played with each other's hair, but I felt like family. It took me a bit longer to figure out why.

We know that Christians living in the Developing World are our brothers and sisters. I'm nearly certain, however, that most of us don't feel it. At the very least, that we don't understand it fully. How could we?

They're so different. It's hard to comprehend that a Westerner could truly feel brother- or sisterhood with someone so unlike them, regardless of faith.

This makes the idea of mission feel awkward. Although we may not realise it, mission starts to look like charity to strangers, not what it is in actuality: sharing amongst family. Fellow children of God.

Kenyan Christians already knew this, without even knowing it was a concept many of us haven't fully realised. They didn't tiptoe around me, because they had accepted me as their sister before I even noticed I hadn't done the same for them.

The truth I realised in Kenya was this: no matter how different another Christian may be from you, your shared faith – your spiritual similarity – is more significant than any earthly dissimilarity. You're family. The bond of belief is so powerful it transcends background, culture, and identity.

The way this relates to mission is simple: giving and receiving from family isn't transactional, nor conditional. As Christians, we are one group, one unit, operating towards one ultimate goal.

Therefore, mission isn't simply a transfer of assets from the privileged to the less so. Mission is sharing amongst family to further God's kingdom. We are brothers and sisters in Christ, and like those of shared blood, we are called to uplift one another, depend on one another, and love one another.

As I write this, after a day of gospel training in Fiji, I am watching the sun set over fields of sugarcane that stretch for miles. I wouldn't be here without absolute certainty that it was God's plan for me. Every day I praise Him for Kenya – the incredible people I met there and everything He opened my eyes to. I'll always be grateful I was called to Africa, because I know something I didn't before.

Mission isn't an indulgence, but a necessity.

MISSIONS PARTNERSHIP SYSTEM

Figtree Anglican Church is committed to supporting gospel-centred mission through a clear and intentional framework. Our Mission Partnership System is built on three tiers, reflecting the depth of relationship and level of support we are able to provide.

TIER 1 - MISSION PARTNERS

These are core partners whose mission, vision, strategy, and values closely align with ours. Their work typically focuses on gospel proclamation and leadership development, particularly among indigenous leaders.

We partner with Tier 1 organisations in three key ways:

Prayerfully – Included in our annual church prayer cycle and prayed for during church services throughout the year.

Practically – We actively look for ways to support these partners, including organising mission trips and encouraging our congregation to serve.

Financially – We commit to raising funds for these partners during our annual World Missions Conference.

TIER 2 - LINK MISSIONS

These organisations are also gospel-aligned and valued partners, although our connection is less extensive than with Tier 1.

We link with Tier 2 partners in the following ways:

Prayerfully – Usually prayed for annually during a designated service.

Practically – We may host events that promote their work or encourage people to join a mission trip and involvement is encouraged.

Financially – While we don't raise funds directly, we facilitate opportunities for our congregation to give or engage (e.g., child sponsorship or Christmas boxes).

Current Tier 2 Link Missions include (but are not limited to): Compassion, Samaritan's Purse, Forever Projects and Watoto.



TIER 3 - OTHER MISSIONS

Many of our members support other mission organisations personally. While not formally partnered with the church, these missions are encouraged and celebrated – especially those that keep gospel proclamation central.

Visibility – These organisations are invited to take part in our Missions Expo during the annual World Missions Conference.

Encouragement – Church leadership supports and encourages members to explore these partnerships as they feel led.

Examples of some of these Tier 3 organisations include: Anglican Aid, Mission Aviation Fellowship, The Gideons International, The Water Gift, Mission to Seafarers, Moore College, Sydney Missionary and Bible College, Wycliffe Australia, Scripture Union, and Anglicare.

MISSION PARTNER APPLICATION SYSTEM

FAC receives many requests for mission partnership each year. All applications are reviewed by our Missions MAT annually in April for consideration.

FAC's support helps train aspiring First Nations Bible translators through the Certificate II in Bible Translation at Nungalinya College in Darwin.

This entry-level program is crucial for the continuation and renewal of translation work in Indigenous First Languages, particularly in the Northern Territory. The course teaches students to read and write in their Indigenous language, as well as Bible translation process and principles, forming an essential foundation for those interested in becoming Bible translators and ensuring the gospel speaks powerfully across generations and cultures.

EVANGELISM EXPLOSION AFRICA

Nigerian Anglican Youth Project

Elizabeth serves and trains young adults in a Middle East church where over 110 different nations are represented every week. FAC's partnership helps the church steward the many gospel opportunities arising there. A particular prayer for the church is that discipleship to Jesus would become the driving priority for those who have recently come to know Him.

Elizabeth is working in the region long-term, developing language skills and building relationships with young people. This includes running training courses and exploring future ministry opportunities.

This project is in partnership with the Anglican Diocese of Nigeria and Evangelism Explosion Africa to equip young leaders to confidently share the gospel through the EE4G ministry. Rod Story and members of FAC will lead the first phase of training 40 youth pastors, selected from a gathering of 1,600 leaders in Asaba, Delta State, to lead outreach in 100 churches. Building on successful launches in Kenya, Uganda, and Ethiopia, this initiative marks a strategic expansion into one of the world's largest and fastestgrowing Christian populations. With ongoing support and training through 2026, this project seeks to establish a sustainable, gospel-centered youth movement across Nigeria.

- Pray that deaf families will be open to the gospel. Many parents fear their children (even in their 30s or 40s) will be taken advantage of, and often prevent them from professing their faith or being baptised.
- For wisdom and grace as we develop clear, culturally and linguistically appropriate gospel materials that effectively reach and disciple the deaf community.

OPEN DOORS

Supporting the persecuted church in India

- In India, converting to Christianity could have you attacked or even killed. Pray that persecuted Christians will be firmly rooted in Jesus to withstand persecution.
- For Christian leaders who risk their lives to serve Jesus. Most face beatings, false accusations, and destruction of their homes.
 Ask God to strengthen their faith.
- For God to help the new coalition government protect all rights, including those of Christians.
- For a spirit of peace and reconciliation as Christians in Manipur State recover and rebuild.
- For the protection of church leaders falsely accused under anti-conversion laws.
- Joel Narayan and the team at Open Doors Australia – as they advocate for those who are persecuted.

AFRICAN ENTERPRISE

- Praise God for 60+ years of gospel impact through African Enterprise's (AE) faithful evangelism across African cities.
 Pray for continued favour and effectiveness in reaching every level of society with the gospel.
- For Simba Musvamhiri's leadership in Australia, asking God to give him wisdom, strength, and vision as he mobilises support and expands AE's impact through churches across the nation.
- Lift up the new Church
 Engagement Officer role, asking
 God to provide the necessary
 funding and the right person
 to grow AE's presence in
 Australian churches and deepen
 partnerships for the gospel.





- Pray for increased prayer, financial, and relational support from mission-minded congregations in Australia, so that AE can continue and expand its vital work across Africa.
- Pray for ongoing impact through projects like the 'Centre for Champions' in Rwanda, that has recently lost all its US Aid funding, asking for new avenues of provision that more vulnerable youth would be empowered with education, skills, and a lifetransforming encounter with Jesus.

GIVING TO OUR MISSION PARTNERS

All giving that is directed to a specific Mission Partner will be allocated exclusively to that partner, regardless of whether the fundraising target for that partner has already been achieved.

In addition to the option of direct giving to a Mission Partner(s), a person can also choose to give to a General Mission Fund.

At its first meeting after the conference, the Missions MAT will make a recommendation to Parish Council as to how all of the money in the General Mission Fund will be distributed to the Mission Partners. This final distribution will be communicated to our church community.

This year, we are also giving you the option to make an additional contribution toward the conference running costs, which is projected to be around \$4,500. No funds given to a Mission Partner or the General Mission Fund will be diverted to this fund.


